


Dear Year 2 Parents,

Unit Work:



Sometimes in school we can disagree with our friends, get angry, feel hurt, sad, left out or lonely. Look at this problem solving wheel. Sometimes we don't always make the expected choice in situations and a small problem can become a big one.

Can you think of three problems that you have had in the shared area.

What would be the best way to solve it from the problem wheel?
What could be the consequence of that?

Look at the example:

problem	Effect on me	solution	consequence
I was playing with the lego and I was making this amazing vehicle but my friend came along and took all the long pieces which I needed to finish my vehicle off.	I felt annoyed and angry at that person	I could talk it out “ I’m sorry but I was hoping to use those pieces, please could I have them?.” I could ignore it.	My friend said I could have the pieces and we worked together to finish it and it was an amazing vehicle. I changed my plan and used different pieces and made an even better vehicle.

With an adult watch what happens when Howard the Bunny gets angry and the consequence of his actions.

ee ea y e


Can you look through your reading books and create word lists for each grapheme? Create your own table like this one. Can you find at least 10 words for each grapheme?

How will we meet your characters at the beginning of the story?


What will be the problem in the story and how will it be solved?

Find a window in your home that you can sit in front of. Create the view. If you don't want to draw your real view then use your imagination and create the view you would like to have.

You could paint, sketch, collage or draw.



Maths

Using your new ruler skills can you draw this?

An alien with

- 4 arms, each 5 cm long
- hands , 2 cm long
- body 10 cm long
- 3 legs, each 7 cm long
- feet 5 cm long



You decide how many eyes, ears and toes it has got. Maybe you could even draw a space craft for it as well? Use your ruler to help you. Remember to press on it so it doesn't move around.

If you're not sure ask an adult or older sibling for some help.

Remember:

Start from zero

Use the centimetres

Write cm after the number when recording the information so we know what the numbers mean.
