Dear KJS parents and guardians,

On **23 August 2021 at 5:30-6:30pm** the KJS Parent Teacher Association would like to invite you to attend, via zoom, a talk by Andrew Fuller about how we can recognise *learning strengths* in order to be more successful. Andrew is a leading clinical psychologist who, along with writing more than 20 books, has developed a new approach to identify a students' learning strengths.

Everyone's brain processes information differently, it is as unique to an individual as their fingerprint. Discovering individual learning strengths enables anyone to understand their own pattern of learning and use this knowledge to increase academic self-efficacy, more powerfully engage in learning, increase performance, gain new skills and discover pathways to success. In this talk, Andrew will discuss with us the main parts of the brain and their roles in learning as well as providing specific strategies for parents in how you can help your child if they have an underactive or overactive brain system. He will share with you information about what you can do to improve the functioning of each part of your child's brain. This presentation brings together over twenty years of research working with young people.
