Return to Full-Day School



Dear KJS Families,

It has been wonderful seeing your children return to school in-person, and we have been amazed at how quickly they are settling back in. As you probably already know, we will begin full-day (2:30 p.m. finish) in-person school from Monday April 25th. This arrangement will be the same as the one in place prior to our move to distance learning in January, including the use of the Hall and 4th floor open area as designated lunch spaces.

For your information, please see the details below.

SCHOOL HOURS:

- 8:30 am (students only can enter the campus from 8am at the security office gate entrance) to 2:30 pm
- Students will have one snack and lunch in one of our dedicated lunch areas - the Hall and 4th floor open area.
- The bus service will run as normal.
- Dismissal procedures for bus riders and walkers will remain unchanged.

SAFETY PROVISIONS:

- Please submit daily Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) confirmation and report, if positive, through the ESF App in line with EDB and CHP requirements.
- Masks must be worn at all times.
- Students must be mindful of physical distancing when on campus.
- All students must bring their own water bottles, one snack, and lunch to school.
- Snacks must be easy to eat finger food (nothing that requires utensils) that can be eaten while wearing a mask.





- Lunch may be food that requires utensils (please bring your own) as it will be eaten without a mask. Please store it in an easy-to-open container that is insulated if necessary (we are unable to warm food for students).
- Each student must bring 2 named masks and a mask holder.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- Teachers will share timetables with you.

FOR THOSE NOT RETURNING:

- We will not be able to provide live online learning.
- We will not be able to provide persistent independent learning.
- You will have access to KJS Virtual Library.
- Teachers will provide some initial guidance regarding independent learning and resources.

We are very pleased to be able to make the move back to full-day learning in-person sooner than expected, and, based on our past experiences, knowledge, and skills, we are confident that we can successfully manage lunchtime eating arrangements.
